The <u>Emerging Minds</u> network would like to invite early career researchers to a workshop hosted by <u>Dr Jen Martin of MindTech</u> at the Institute of Mental Health, University of Nottingham.

<u>Emerging Minds</u> is a mental health research network funded by UK Research & Innovation (UKRI) with the aim of encouraging research across sectors and disciplines. We want to reduce the prevalence of mental health problems amongst children and young people through mental health promotion, prevention and early treatment.

The Emerging Minds network has a fund of £500,000 to share to enable research collaborations. We have prioritised 4 <u>research challenges</u> from the questions that young people, families, practitioners and policy makers have told us are most important and pressing.

The purpose of this workshop is to support Early Career Researchers to develop their research ideas into fundable, collaborative project proposals. The objectives of the event are:

- To better enable Early Career Researchers to build the partnerships and collaborations needed to bring their research ideas to fruition.
- To support Early Career Researchers to develop their proposal development skills.
- To explore the wider opportunities offered by the Emerging Minds network including mentoring and short term fellowships.
